**9,351 supportive homes & shelter beds**—building refuge for our most vulnerable populations.

### Sheltering the Most Vulnerable Californians

Proposition IC will provide emergency shelters for battered women and homeless families, affordable homes for seniors and working families, and homes for former foster youth. This measure will be funded out of existing state resources without raising taxes.

In our communities, the problems of homelessness, home affordability, and domestic violence are getting progressively worse:

- More than 360,000 Californians are homeless every night.
- Last year, 5,108 women and children were turned away from full domestic-violence shelters.
- Home affordability is at a historical low.

### Safe shelter is fundamental to a decent life. Under Prop IC:

- Homeless families and battered women will find safe shelter.
- Retired seniors, people with disabilities, and former foster youth will be able to rent in their communities.
- Working families will proudly buy their first home.
- New, full-time jobs will be created.
